This charter is based upon the values of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. We understand that we are all working together to ensure access to these rights for everyone.

With Christ as our guide and example we celebrate the uniqueness of the individual.

Together we will try to: Learn from Jesus; Love like Jesus; Live like Jesus.

All children have the right to practise their religion. Governments must respect the rights of parents to give their children guidance about this right.

Article 14

Children

Follow the teachings of Jesus as a model for my life

Behave respectfully during prayer, mass and collective worship.

Respect other people's religion even if it is different to our own.

Reflect on the meanings of my prayers

Parents

Support the mission and ethos of the school and its efforts to teach the Catholic faith

Provide opportunities for children to practise their faith

Support Parish sacramental programmes and activities as appropriate

Encourage children to show mutual respect and tolerance towards people with different faiths and beliefs

School

Support the mission and ethos of the school and the teachings of the Catholic Church

Encourage the community to participate in collective worship, Mass and non Eucharistic celebrations

Support Parish sacramental programmes as appropriate

Provide opportunities for children to learn about different religions and beliefs

All children have the right to education and personal development Articles 28 and 29

Children

Have a positive, proactive approach to my learning, accepting mistaken as part of the process

Listen carefully and respect the right of others to learn

Take responsibility for the things I need

Take advantage of all opportunities to learn

Use support and help when required.

Complete my homework and hand it in on time

Use resources independently for further my learning

Parents

Bring children to school on time

Not request holidays during school time

Encourage children to regularly complete reading and homework activities

Encourage children to be independent and look after their belongings

Work in partnership with teachers and children

Attend parents' meetings as scheduled and when requested

School

Make learning fun and ensure children are happy to come to school

Encourage a love of learning through first hand experiences

Provide individual support when needed

Ensure that work is set which enables children to achieve mastery of the key objectives and provides appropriate challenge

Work in partnership with parents and children

All children have the right to an opinion and to be listened to Article 12

Children

Have the courage to express my opinions appropriately

Learn to trust in others judgements and decisions.

Respect others opinions, thoughts and feelings.

Tell an adult if I am being bullied or see bullying happening

Understand that mistakes are an important part of learning and developing

Parents

Listen to children and share their concerns with school

Explain why decisions are made that are sometimes not what children would choose

Encourage a confident, resilient attitude in my children

School

Provide opportunities for children to share their opinions in class and through the school council

Respect children's opinions and explain decisions

Help and support children when they have a problem with unkind behaviours or bullying

Provide opportunities to develop children's self -esteem and resilience

All children have the Right to good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment.

Article 24

Children

Ensure food from home is healthy and nutritious.

Respect my food and appreciate those who make it.

Save water and electricity and have respect for the school and its grounds.

Consider the environment – pick up litter and recycle things

Be hygienic around school to ensure others can stay healthy – e.g. flush the toilet and wash my hands

Take regular exercise

Respect the equipment I have by using it properly and keeping it tidy

Parents

Provide a healthy packed lunch for children

Send children with a water bottle each day

Keep children at home if they are sick so that germs are not spread

Check for head lice regularly and treat them before sending children into school

Work in partnership with school to help children understand how to live a healthy life and respect the rights of others to a clean environment

Encourage children to take regular exercise

School

Organise a stimulating and comfortable environment

Keep school and playground clean and ensure children have what they need to keep themselves clean

Ensure staff are well trained in First Aid and Health and Safety

Teach children about healthy living

Help children to understand about sustainable living

Work in partnership with the school nurse and other professionals to support children's development

Provide a wide variety of activities that support children's physical, social and emotional development

All children have the Right to be cared for and kept safe. Article 19

Children

Share my worries or concerns and be a good friend to others

Show how I care for others through my words and actions.

Follow the school behaviour code and my class agreement

Don't put myself or others in danger

Use apparatus and equipment in the way I have been shown

Tell an adult if someone has hurt or frightened me

Respect my parent's and teacher's decision about what is safe

Don't give out personal information without asking my parents

Help to keep myself safe online by following advice and making sensible choices

Parents

Make sure children arrive and leave school safely and on time

Help children to respect the safety of others

Support the school behaviour code, demonstrating understanding of rights, responsibilities, forgiveness and reconciliation for all children

Send children to school with full, named uniform, safe shoes, PE kit and a coat when it is cold

Ensure children have enough sleep and nutrition so they can concentrate in school

Ensure children are able to go online safely and are protected from unsuitable and age inappropriate media material

Approach the school directly to address any issues which arise at school.

Refrain from making negative comments about the school via social media

School

Provide a safe and secure environment in line with our Safeguarding policy

Ensure that children feel they can share their concerns

Support the school behaviour code, demonstrating understanding of rights, responsibilities, forgiveness and reconciliation for all children

Support parents to ensure children learn to be caring and thoughtful individuals

Work with children to enable them to solve problems and make appropriate decisions independently

Ensure that children are able to go online safely in school

Teach children to use social media appropriately with the same care and respect as face to face interaction

Every child has the right to relax and play Article 31

Children

Make the most of the time I have to relax and play.

Respect other children's right to relax and play.

Share and treat the environment and equipment carefully

Contribute to the school community by getting involved and making a difference

Parents

Ensure children have enough time to relax and play at home

Encourage children to make a wide variety of friendships

Encourage children to be active and take advantage of clubs offered at school to develop their talents and interests

Encourage children to get involved in different areas of school life

School

Provide activities which cater for a range of interest, abilities and talents

Provide opportunities for children to play collaboratively and creatively

Provide opportunities for children to self-manage appropriate risk

Provide opportunities for all children to take an active role in the school community
